The NISAR satellite mission is a collaborative project between NASA and the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) aimed at transforming how we observe and understand changes on Earth's surface. Using a unique combination of NASA's L-band Radar and ISRO's S-band Radar. NISAR will capture high resolution images in all weather conditions, day or night scheduled to launch from Shriharikota, India, aboard a GSLVMK-II rocket. The mission will monitor movements of land and ice, track natural hazards such as earthquakes, landslides, volcanic eruptions and flood and provide crucial data for studying climate change and managing natural resources. By delivering precise, consistent and global measurements, the NISAR mission will help scientists, policy-makers and communities better predict, prepare for and respond to environmental challenges. The NISAR satellite will study climate changes and support agriculture and ecosystem monitoring by combining data from both Radars. NASA will offer unprecedented accuracy in mapping and measuring Earth's dynamic processes making it one of the most important Earth Science mission of the decade.

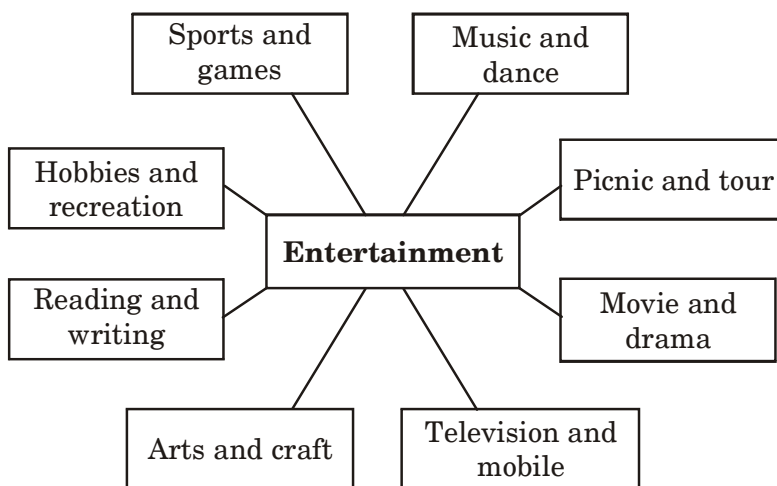

Water is a chemical substance that is composed of hydrogen and oxygen (H₂O) and is vital for all known forms of life. In typical usage, 'water' refers only to its liquid form, but it also has a solid state, ice and a gaseous state, water vapor or steam. Water covers 71% of the Earth's surface. On Earth, it is found mostly in oceans and other large bodies of water, with 1.6% of water below ground in

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aquifers and 0.001% in the air as vapor, clouds and precipitation. Oceans hold 97% of surface water, glaciers and polar ice caps 2.4% and other land surface water such as rivers, lakes and ponds 0.6%. Additionally a minute amount of the Earth's water is contained within biological bodies and manufactured products.
